What's Different



Monthly!



- Features and changes pushed and tested throughout the year
- Issues triaged and solved closer to the time they were developed.
- ESR benefits from this!



Stability



- Lessons learned from last year with code introduced and eventually merged that was difficult to test.
- Larger project initiatives to benefit long term
 - Database back end
 - Calendar rebuild
- No rush to include features that aren't fully baked



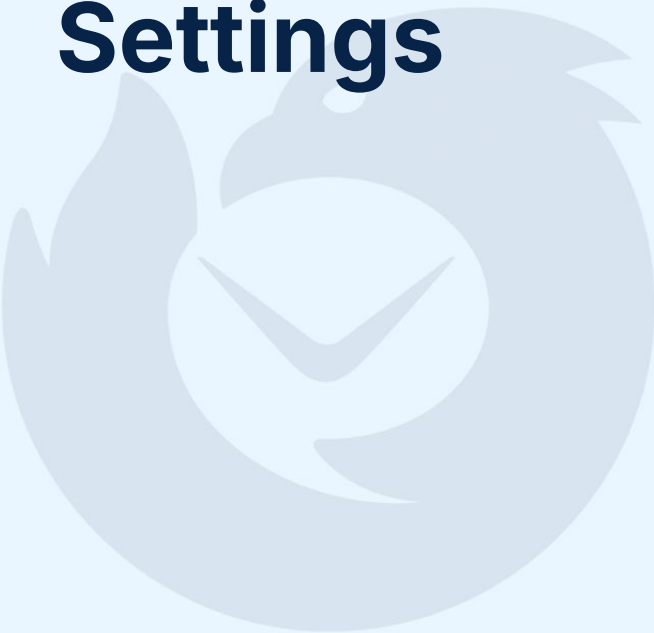
What's In



Dark Messages Mode

- Automatically adapt the message to the dark style if the application is in dark mode.
- Option to show a toggle in the header to temporarily disable the dark mode styling in case of visual problems.
- The feature can be disabled in the settings.

Appearance Settings



- Global control of message list layout (cards, table, threaded, unthreaded, grouped by sort)
- Control cards view row count (2 rows VS 3 rows)
- Set default sorting order and globally propagate to all folders

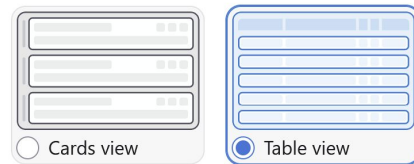


Table View Options

Sorting and Threading

Define the default sorting and threading options for newly created folders.

Default Threading:





Manually Sort Folders

- Click and drag on any user-created folder to reorder them.
- Community-powered, long standing request
- Support from engineering team for tweaks and tests



Account Hub for Email Setup

- Not on startup but from the second email forward
- Autodiscovery of address books and calendars
- Intuitive guided flow



Native Notifications Action

- Thunderbird now uses native OS notifications for Windows, macOS, and Linux.
- Notifications also now offer quick actions like delete and mark as read. With more up our sleeve for future releases!



Experimental Exchange Email Support

- Enable it via preference to set up a Microsoft Exchange account natively in Thunderbird.
- More improvements are coming to 141 & 142



Export for Mobile

- Quickly generate a QR code to dynamically transfer all your account configurations and credentials to your Thunderbird on Android.
- Scan the QR code via TFA to complete the setup process



Enable Horizontal Scroll for Table View

- Small quality of life improvement for users with complex tabular data in their message list
- Add the ability to let the message list scroll horizontally and behave like a spreadsheet or file manager.

What didn't quite make the cut...

- Full Microsoft Exchange support
 - We only support EWS, so newer accounts with GraphAPI won't be supported yet.
 - No calendar or address book sync.
- New UI for Chat, Tasks, and Settings
- New Calendar UI
- New Account Hub for first time user experience (will be enabled in 142)
- New Account Hub for Address Book setup/autodiscovery (will be enabled in 141)

- Get important features earlier
